### Release rationale

# Template package library

This incremental release of the Advance Care Directive Custodian end product introduces the Template Package Library as a new product component. This version of the template package library contains all template packages available for the Advance Care Directive Custodian document type at the time of publication.

Of those template packages, the following is aligned with the PCEHR Conformance Profile for Consumer Entered Information  $v1.3^1$ :

Future versions of the template package library will contain template packages aligned with the latest version of the PCEHR Conformance Profile, but not previous versions.

### Introduction

This release note introduces specifications associated with Advance Care Directive Version 1.0.

This solution bundle as detailed below is released with the following supporting document;

• Advance Care Directive Information Requirements v1.0

### Role

The role of this release is to define the goal-state solution for the content of the advance care directive custodian link in the Consolidated View, communicated between healthcare providers.

# Scope

The PCEHR System will provide a link to the location of an Individual's Advance Care Directive through the Consolidated View.

The Advance Care Directive document will not be stored in the current version of the PCEHR. Future versions of the PCEHR System may include electronically stored Directives.

An Advance Care Directive is a statement by a competent person expressing decisions about his or her future care, should he or she become incapable of participating in medical treatment decisions.

Each Australian state and territory has their own Advance Care Directive (or Advance Health Directive) form which must be completed and signed by the individual.

Currently, the completed directive is kept in a safe place, and copies of the document are given to the Individual's family, solicitor or appointed attorney for health matters.

The individual, their authorised representative or their Healthcare Provider may input the Directive location information into the PCEHR. The authorised representative may be a relative, friend, attorney, healthcare provider, Medicare or PCEHR Call Centre staff.

The individual may enter the Advance Care Directive location information via the Consumer Portal.
