Release rationale

This incremental release of the Shared Health Summary end product (EP-2397:2017) introduces an updated version of the *Shared Health Summary – My Health Record Usability Recommendations*.

Version 1.3 of the Shared Health Summary - My Health Record Usability Recommendations incorporates minor amendments to existing recommendations to align with the latest Shared Health Summary – Structured Content Specification and the renaming of the PCEHR system to the My Health Record system. It also aligns with updated versions of the Event Summary – PCEHR Usability Recommendations and Clinical Documents - My Health Record Usability Recommendations.

These usability recommendations have been developed in consultation with key general practice peak bodies to improve the user experience of general practice software products. Vendors of clinical information systems used outside of general practice settings are encouraged to consider the extent to which these recommendations are applicable to their software products.

Please note:

The *My Health Records Act 2012* restricts the authoring and uploading of shared health summaries to the My Health Record system to nominated healthcare providers. The My Health Records Act defines a nominated healthcare provider, in part, as an individual who is registered by a registration authority with one of the following occupations within the meaning of the National Law:

- medical practitioner
- registered nurse; or
- Aboriginal health practitioner, Torres Strait Islander health practitioner or Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health practitioner with a Certificate IV in Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Primary Health Care (Practice).

The full definition of a nominated healthcare provider and the meaning of National Law is given in the <u>My Health Records Act</u>, available from the Australian Government Federal Register of Legislation.

Release note

Release rationale

This incremental release of the Shared Health Summary end product introduces *Shared Health Summary – PCEHR Usability Recommendations*. This new product component replaces the *Supplementary Guidance for Implementers* product component introduced with the previous version of this end product.

The *PCEHR Usability Recommendations* document contains implementation guidance previously published in *Supplementary Guidance for Implementers*. The new format "usability recommendations" makes it easier for implementers to assess whether their software conforms to the guidance.

PCEHR *usability recommendations* are not part of PCEHR *conformance requirements*. Only the latter are used as the basis for conformance assessments performed as a prerequisite to PCEHR system integration. PCEHR usability recommendations can be used by implementers to perform usability assessments on a voluntary basis, for example, with the aim of providing their users with a consistently high level of usability.

PCEHR usability recommendations provided with this release also contain additional guidance for implementers developed as part of NEHTA's Clinical Usability Program (CUP) Release 2.

This incremental release of the Shared Health Summary end product updates supplementary guidance for the implementation of Shared Health Summary documents, representing a key outcome of NEHTA's Clinical Usability Program (CUP) Release 1.

CUP Release 1 has been focused on resolving key usability issues with clinical information systems used by general practitioners. The guidance provided as part of this release represents the outcomes of several workshops with clinical consultation groups. Note that additional guidance resulting from CUP Release 1 is released as updates to other specification products, namely Common – Clinical Document v1.1.1 and PCEHR B2B Gateway Services.

This update of supplementary guidance is limited to the rephrasing of the information to be displayed by clinical systems prior to the submission of a Shared Health Summary document. The updated wording is based on guidance from the Commonwealth Department of Health.
